Ann Millner began working at Weber State College in 1982. In 2002 she became the first female president of Weber State University and of an institution of higher education in Utah. She served as president until 2012. In 2014, Millner was elected as a senator for the Utah State Senate. This collection contains administrative papers and memorabilia acquired during her presidency.

LaVon Carroll was an English and literature professor at Weber State from 1962-1986. She is also a poet and writer who has published several poems and books, and has received numerous awards for her work as a professor and writer. This collection contains LaVon's writings, awards, research, and instruction materials.

Ruth Stewart Swenson began working at Weber College in 1953, and served as the first director of an experimental two year nursing program. This collection contains meeting minutes, reports, agendas, statistics, curriculum, requisitions, memoranda, newsletters, personal writings, newspaper clippings, photographs, event flyers, and programs.

The nursing program at Weber College was established in 1953. In prior years Weber ran a joint program with the Dee Hospital in the 1920s-1940s and the St. Benedict's Hospital from 1940s-1960s. Jean Bickmore White taught political science at Weber State from 1969-1989. She was well-versed and well respected for her knowledge of the Utah state constitution. This collection contains teaching and research files, as well as draft manuscripts of several of White's publications.

Martha (Martie) Howard Collett was an instructor of library science at Weber State College in 1965. In 1971 she became a founding curator of Special Collections. Jean Anne Waterstradt attended Weber College in 1942 and was the first female editor of the Signpost. She was a member of the WSU Emeriti Alumni Council and a member of the Friends of the Stewart Library Board. This collection contains student publications from BYU and Weber College, it also includes her 2008 Honorary Hood.

This collection contains information about the sororities and fraternities that were at Weber State, reports, meeting minutes, newsletters, notes, and memorabilia.

[Otyokwa records, 1942-1987](#)

Otyokwa was a sorority at Weber from 1932-2004. The sorority was established to promote worthy school citizenship, wholesome social life, and high scholarship. In 1982 the sorority became apart of Chi Omega but did not stay in the national sorority. This collection contains scrapbooks, financial information, event programs, photos, newspaper clippings, and memorabilia.

La Dianaeda was one of the longest-running sororities at Weber State starting in 1934 and disbanding in 2006. The group's purpose was to further culture, beauty, and friendliness. This collection contains awards, photos, leadership records, a logbook, and clothing.

Chanodo was a sorority at Weber College from 1939-1957. The sorority was established to give help and friendship to the poor and needy and to promote friendship among the students. This collection contains a guest register.

The Associated Women Students (AWS) was an organization created to provide a way for the female students to socialize, promote school activities, and provide a medium for women to express themselves. These records contain the constitution, minutes, fliers, brochures, correspondence, programs, and scrapbooks from the AWS.

The Whip Club was composed of female students who supported school activities, create and helped maintain college spirit among the student body of Weber College. This collection contains scrapbooks and the president's plaque.

Marie Kotter was the first woman to sit on the executive committee at Weber College and became the first female vice president at a four-year institution in Utah. This collection contains administrative files, surveys, financial reports, correspondence, and annual reports.

The Faculty Women's Association was established in 1935 and dissolved around 1985. The purpose of the association was to promote friendship and support the growth of the college. This collection contains minutes, binders, financial reports, membership information, general files, and scrapbooks.

The Commission on the Status of Women was created as a deliberating agency that was tasked with achieving equal opportunity for female employees at Weber State College. This opportunity included salary equalization, the appointment of women to administrative college committees, and including in policy-making positions. This collection contains the group's constitution and bylaws.
